SCOTT BERGE - The attempts on President M. Lindsay's life at the elections and during Geo-Trig.

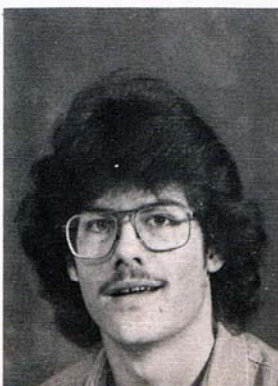
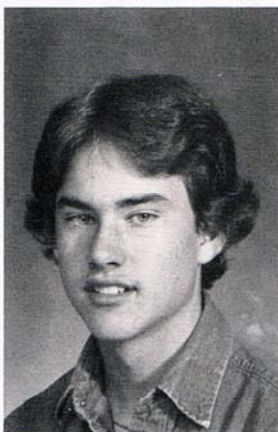

ROB CARNIE - Pearson's parties and me, Brad, Epp, Liane Kern, and Judy McEwan rolling Brad's car in River Park.

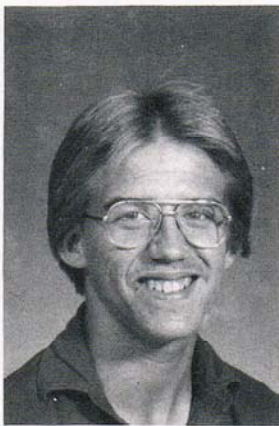
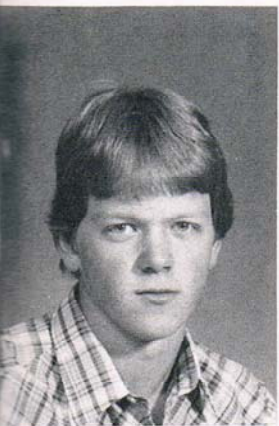
SIMON CHOW - I shall always remember the day when Mr. McIver perfected his secret formula for instant hair growth.

MITCHELL COX - Winning the Provincial basketball championships with half the school out to cheer for us last season.

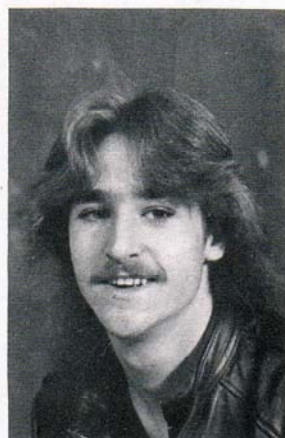

get slashed by Smith in the Cup playoffs.

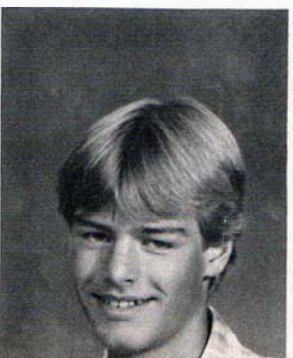
PAULA HADWEN - Being locked in the band

heard my desperate cries for rescue.

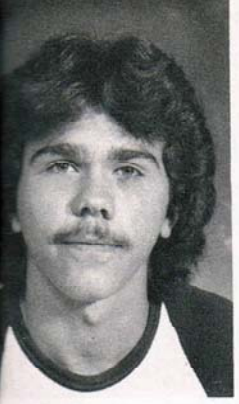

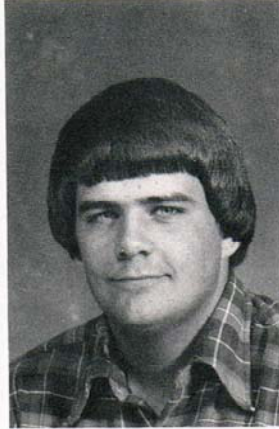




MARK KNOTT - Falling asleep in grade ten history, and Christmas Lits in grade ten, and parties.

DOUG McLEOD - Having my sentence at Central Penitentiary prolonged for an extra year.

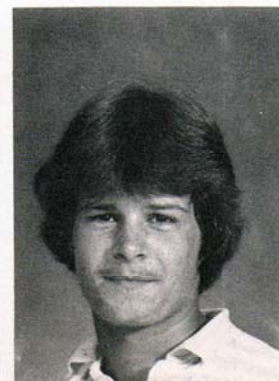

ALLISON PETIT - Winning Chity Champs in football and City Cheerleading all in one year, 1982.

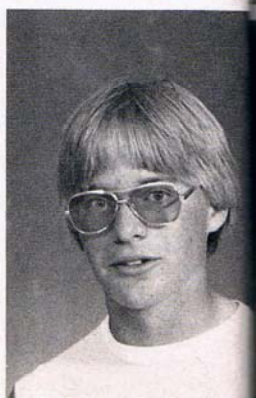
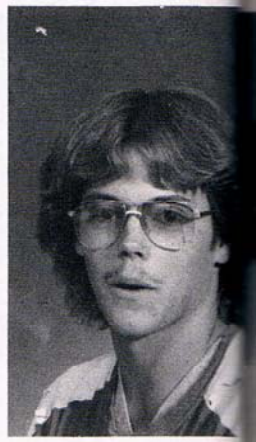
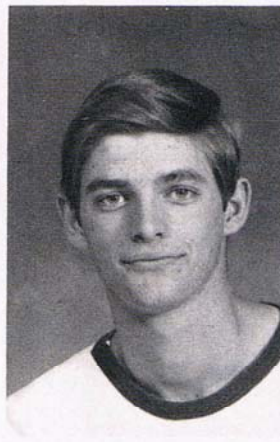
