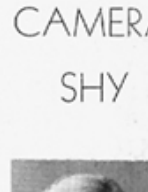
May Wong — May is hidden at the back of the room but how could we forget her with Miss Irwin around, for May is our "French Brain". We also enjoy May's company during Literature periods.
