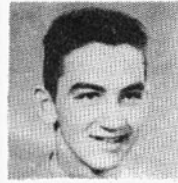
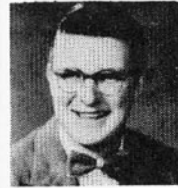


1952-53 GRADS

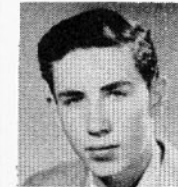

Rodney Johnston—At home it is his hobby, at school it is his hoax, but we're sure that Rod will get his "degree" in Chemistry.



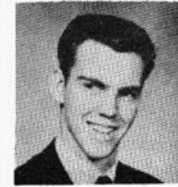

Gaye McWalters—This brown-haired girl is the star of the Rockettes. And with all the high marks she gets in the future she is sure to be a comptometer operator you will see.

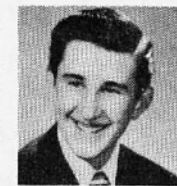
Eleanor McCarthy—Eleanor came back to our school at Christmas. And full of fun and wit this miss is. She hopes to become a famous journalist.
