Her success in a business course we all soon shall see.

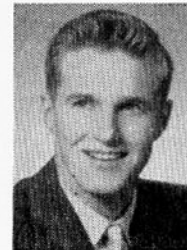


Glen Helson

As a favoured teacher of pupils we know she will climb.

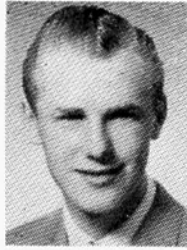


Bob Henderson

yellin'!



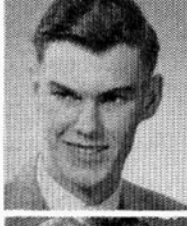
Alta Young

or snow.



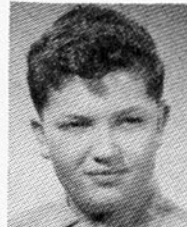
Len Shears
