F.S.: "I'll kill you, Richardson."

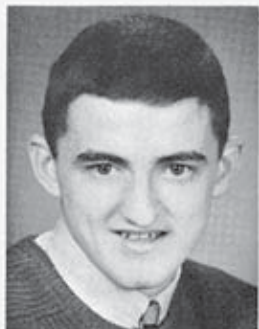

F.S.: "Ah, shut up Katz and let's go."



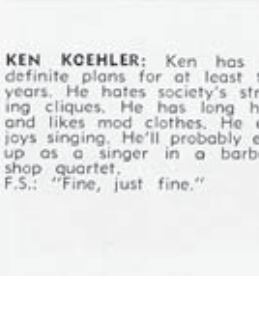
JACK KERGAN: Jack is liked by all his classmates and by most of the teachers also. He is a good student. He plans to further his education after grade twelve at U. of S.
