Pat Dyck was a new student at CCI this year. She left after completing the first semester, but like all other students, Pat enjoyed the breaks and spares in class time.



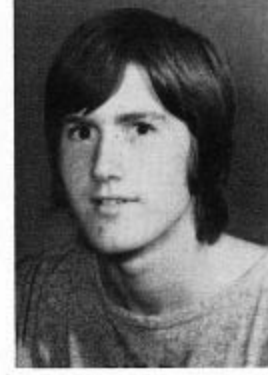

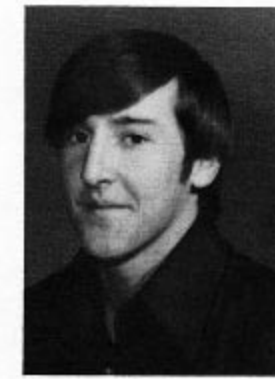

Don Caldwell is fond of sleeping, talking and whatever is nasty. He hasn't had a most memorable experience yet, but it will likely be the day he leaves.



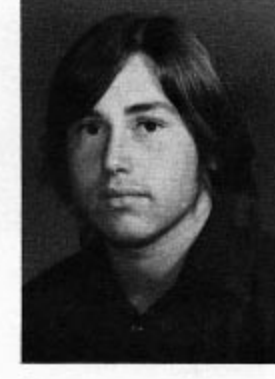
Jerry Kilkenny's favourite pastime seems to be lipping off to teachers and we all know how much he enjoys the short skirts.

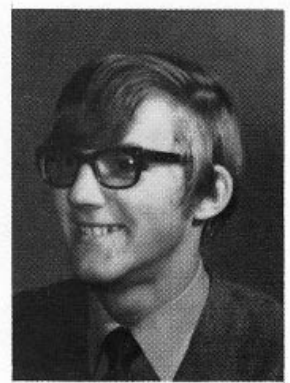
